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## Mission Statement

The mission of Conner High School is to assist students in the transition from adolescence to adult life. Providing a rigorous program of study will prepare all students for post-secondary options. Encouraging diversity of thought and skill development facilitates life-long learning. ## Introduction and Accreditation

Conner High School opened its doors for the first time on October 15, 1970 with less than 600 students in grades 10 - 12. It was built as a result of the overcrowded conditions at Boone County High School. The land for the new school was donated by the Conner family, and it was decided that the school would be named in remembrance of this generous donation. In 2021 Conner High School graduated its fifty-first class. Conner High School serves the northern portion of Boone County, Kentucky, including the communities of Hebron, Petersburg, and northern Burlington and is one of four high schools in the Boone County School District.

Conner has approximately 1500 students divided into grades 9-12. Conner High School is accredited by AdvancED, with the District receiving recertification through 2022. Conner operates on a 4X4 block schedule and offers a variety of elective courses, Honors, AP, and Dual Enrollment Courses as well as courses through the Boone County Area Technology Center, the Ignite Institute, and the Building Industry Association of Northern Kentucky. Conner also has an active Internship program with various community partners and has developed outstanding programs in Engineering, Music, Fine Arts, and Media Production, all having been recognized at regional and state levels.

Conner High School has Dual Credit partnerships through the following post-secondary institutions: Eastern Kentucky University, Gateway Community and Technical College, Murray State University, Northern Kentucky University, and Thomas More University. Conner also regularly sends students to the Gatton Academy of Mathematics and Science in Kentucky and to the Craft Academy for Excellence in Science and Mathematics.

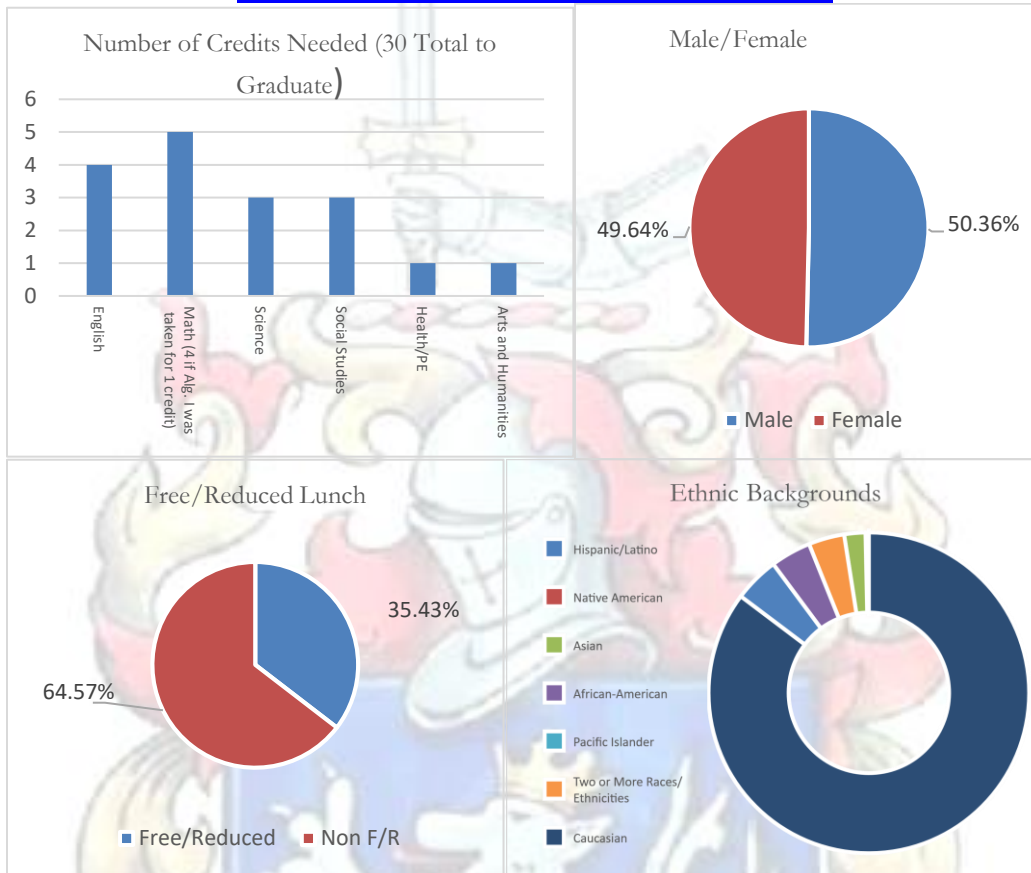

Valedictorian and Salutatorian are determined by the highest average of the numeric final grades for all credits in high school, along with AP participation in ALL core subjects. Class rank is determined by ranking the numeric average of the final grades for all credits taken in high school for each student.

Students who are taking regular academic classes can earn up to 100 quality points for each class; students taking honors classes can earn up to 102 quality points for each class, and students taking Advanced Placement or Dual Credit classes can earn up to 104 quality points. All credits earned in grades 9-12 calculate into GPA and class rank.
