Who may apply: Must be enrolled full time as a high school senior in Kentucky, plan to enter a college in the U.S. no later than the fall following graduation, demonstrate a strong commitment to pursuing and completing a bachelor's degree at an accredited non-profit public or private institution in the United States, demonstrate financial need, be involved in co-curricular and community service activities, demonstrate integrity and perseverance in overcoming adversity, maintain at least a 2.0 GPA and be a U.S. citizen and resident of Kentucky.
