Good News Report

- BCHS had five students accepted into All State Band/Orchestra—more than any other district in Northern KY.
- All State Choir: BCHS had two students who received a perfect 10 on sight reading music and another student with a 9.9!
- BCHS has an agreement with BSM Sports for under-armor gear.
- Over 100 senior English 4 students went on a field trip to Cincy Shakespeare Company to see the play *Twelfth Night*. Mrs. Birkenhauer commented on their excellent behavior and that the Company praised our students for their attentiveness and participation.
- Peggy Dunn and Linda Plei earned their National Boards.
- In November for the ninth year, Mrs. Lindsey was again selected to speak KCTM (the Kentucky Council of Teachers of Mathematics).
- Mr. Schlotman received the Outstanding Administrator Award from the Kentucky Music Educators.
- Girls' Bowling Team won over Holy Cross; top bowlers were Riley Humphrey, Skylar Brinkley, and Kara Strong.
- Kara Strong was named Top Bowler at the Holiday Classic Bowling Tournament bowling a 164 and 290.
- Boys' Bowling Team has a 5-0 record.
- The Quick Recall Team defeated Walton-Verona 24-8 on December 4th.
- All three basketball teams had wins at Williamstown December 11.
- The Lady Rebels had their first District win in four years defeating Cooper 63-57.
- BCHS's Wrestling team finished in eighth place in Louisville's completion last weekend. Senior Ethan Huffman and junior CeJay Vaske each placed second in their categories; David Bodenbender finished third.
- BCHS Cheerleaders were State Runners-up in the Small School Division.
- Students who made it into the 2019 Kentucky Music Educators' Association All State Band/Orchestra were Trent Ripberger, Hailey Simonds, Patrick Medovich, Aiden Shinkle-Kramer, and Darren Takoka. They competed against hundreds of students.
