General Panel Member Norms

- Be engaged in the presentation (no cell phone use-please silence)
- Save comments and additional questions until the end of the interview
- Refrain from eating and side conversations
- Student information should be kept confidential
- Be open-minded and collaborate with other panel members regarding student interaction
- Provide students with positive and constructive feedback
