- F Pau **Soldier's heart : being the story of the enlistment and due service of the boy Charley Goddard in the First Minnesota Volunteers : a novel of the Civil War.** Paulsen, Gary. New York, N.Y. : Dell Laurel-Leaf, 2000, c1998. Eager to enlist, fifteen-year-old Charley has a change of heart after experiencing both the physical horrors and mental anguish of Civil War combat.
- Fic Bru **Code talker : a novel about the Navajo Marines of World War Two.** Bruchac, Joseph, 1942-. New York : Scholastic, c2005. After being taught in a boarding school run by whites that Navajo is a useless language, Ned Begay and other Navajo men are recruited by the Marines to become Code Talkers, sending messages during World War II in their native tongue.
- FIC DOW **Shooting the moon.** Dowell, Frances O'Roark. 1st ed. New York : Atheneum Books for Young Readers, c2008. When her brother is sent to fight in Vietnam, twelve-year-old Jamie begins to reconsider the army world that she has grown up in.
- Fic Ell **A troubled peace.** Elliott, Laura. 1st ed. New York : Katherine Tegen Books, c2009. Nineteen-year-old pilot Henry Forester, having returned home to Virginia after fighting in World War II, is consumed by worry over the well-being of the people who helped him escape Nazi-occupied Germany and returns to France, where he is shocked to see the ravages of war and tries to regain internal peace.
- Fic Ell **Under a war-torn sky.** Elliott, Laura. 1st ed. New York : Hyperion Paperbacks For Children, c2001. After his plane is shot down by Hitler's Luftwaffe, nineteen-year-old Henry Forester of Richmond, Virginia, strives to walk across occupied France, with the help of the French Resistance, in hopes of rejoining his unit.
- Fic HES **A light in the storm : the Civil War diary of Amelia Martin.** Hesse, Karen. 1st ed. New York : Scholastic, 1999. In 1860 and 1861, while working in her father's lighthouse on an island off the coast of Delaware, fifteen-year-old Amelia records in her diary how the Civil War is beginning to devastate her divided state.
- FIC KAD **Cracker! : the best dog in Vietnam.** Kadohata, Cynthia. New York : Atheneum Books for Young Readers, c2007. A young soldier in Vietnam bonds with his bomb-sniffing dog.

A boy takes refuge in the jungle with his elephant when the Viet Cong launch an attack on his village in the aftermath of the Vietnam War.

Ivan fearlessly enlists in the United States Army in hopes of becoming a war hero like his father, but after being trained as a sniper and getting sent into the jungle of Vietnam, Ivan begins to question the war.

James Edmond, a sixteen-year-old orphan, keeps a journal of his experiences and those of "G" Company which he joined as a volunteer in the Union Army during the Civil War.
- Fic Mye **Sunrise over Fallujah.** Myers, Walter Dean, 1937-. 1st ed. New York : Scholastic Press, 2008.  
Robin Perry, from Harlem, is sent to Iraq in 2003 as a member of the Civilian Affairs Battalion, and his time there profoundly changes him.
- FIC BUR **All the broken pieces : a novel in verse.** Burg, Ann E. 1st ed. New York : Scholastic Press, 2009.  
Two years after being airlifted out of Vietnam in 1975, Matt Pin is haunted by the terrible secret he left behind and, now, in a loving adoptive home in the United States, a series of profound events forces him to confront his past.
- FIC Cra **The red badge of courage.** Crane, Stephen. 1st ed. New York : Atheneum Books for Young Readers, c2002.  
During his service in the Civil War a young Union soldier matures to manhood and finds peace of mind as he comes to grips with his conflicting emotions about war.
- Fic DEN **The journal of William Thomas Emerson : a Revolutionary War patriot.** Denenberg, Barry. New York : Scholastic, c1998.  
William, a twelve-year-old orphan, writes of his experiences in pre-Revolutionary War Boston where he joins the cause of the patriots who are opposed to the British rule.
- Fic Rem **All quiet on the western front.** Remarque, Erich Maria, 1898-1970. Boston : Little Brown, c1958.  
Depicts the experiences of a group of young German soldiers fighting and suffering during the last days of World War I.
