

Ockerman Elementary Site Based Policy 9.2

Ockerman Elementary School Educational Enhancement Opportunity

The Ockerman Elementary School Educational Opportunity shall follow the Boone County Board of Education Attendance Requirements (09.122.3) when making decisions on approval or disapproval to a student. In addition to the Boone County Policy, Ockerman Elementary School will require:

1. Educational Enhancement Opportunity form submitted to the Principal no later than 2 days before the education enhancement opportunity is to take place.
2. Within one (1) week of the student's return to the school from the educational enhancement opportunity, he or she will submit in written report to the teacher, at the student's achievement level, and report orally to the classroom the significance of his/her trip based on Kentucky Core Academic Standards covered during the trip.

3. Boone County Board Policy 09.122.3:

Exceptions to Presence at School (continued)

Students participating in an educational enhancement opportunity shall be counted as being in attendance during the instructional school day, provided the Principal has given prior approval. Students shall be granted up to ten (10) school days to pursue an educational enhancement opportunity determined by the Principal to be of significant value. This opportunity may include, but not limited to, participation in an educational foreign exchange program or an intensive instructional, experimental, or performance program in one (1) of the core curriculum subjects of English, science, mathematics, social studies, foreign language, and the arts. Unless the Principal determines that extenuating circumstances exist, requests for date(s) falling within state or district testing periods shall not be granted. The Principal's determination may be appealed to the Superintendent/designee whose decision may be appealed to the Board under grievance policy and procedures. Students participating in educational enhancement opportunities under this section shall have the opportunity to make up school work missed and shall not have his/her class grades adversely affected for lack of class attendance or class participation due to non-presence at school.
