Dear Parent/Guardian:

Kentucky students took the Kentucky Summative Assessment (KSA) in the Spring of 2021. Previously these tests were called Kentucky Performance Rating for Educational Progress (K-PREP). The tests were developed by Kentucky teachers and align with the *Kentucky Academic Standards* in each content area. As current standards had been measured in operational state assessments, the KSA name has been applied.

KSA is the annual summative assessment given in grades 3 through 8, 10 and 11 to Kentucky public school students.

#### Online Testing – Content and Grades

- Quality of School Climate and Safety Survey (20 min) – Grades 3 – 8, 10 and 11
- Reading (60 min) – Grades 3-8 and 10
- Mathematics (60 min) – Grades 3-8 and 10
- Science (60 min) – Grades 4,7 and 11
- On-Demand Writing (90 min) – Grades 5, 8 and 11

These assessments are Kentucky’s measure of student proficiency and progress on the state content standards. These standards establish goals for what all students should know and be able to do in each grade. For the first time, the KSA was given online with only a small percentage of students taking it on paper. This assessment goes beyond multiple-choice questions. It includes extended response where students create a written response and technology-enhanced items where students interact with the computer to demonstrate critical thinking and problem-solving skills.

When considering your child’s performance, it is important to consider the learning contexts and experiences during this school year as many students/schools faced unprecedented challenges because of the novel coronavirus (COVID-19).

This annual assessment provides critical information about student learning, but no single assessment should ever be the sole factor in making an educational decision. It is important to remember that assessments provide only one measure of student learning, but when combined with grades, classroom activities, unit quizzes and tests, and district-level assessments, the end-of-year assessments can help provide a more complete picture of your child’s abilities over the course of the school year and path toward academic success on these content standards.

State assessments are one of several strategies to better understand how students performed academically as part of Boone County School District COVID-19 academic recovery efforts. The data provides a point-in-time “temperature check” that allows districts to better track and address student’s academic needs.
